- 3. New Business
 - a. Reports from sub-committees

i. Black History sub-committee

- 1. Have already started recording the program. Including the contest winners and performers. All of the content that has been received is well put together.
- 2. It will be released on the 21st at 5 PM. It will be the same as MLK on the City Channel, CN2 Extra, and live streamed on the City's youtube as well.
- 3. Cityofrockhill.com/bhm will give folks access to all of the viewing options and information.
- 4. Poetry slam winners have been asked to submit a video of their poem as the quality of the zoom video is not great. If not, we will use the zoom recording.
- 5. Prizes: We only had one qualifying entry for oratory contest, there was supposed to be a \$25 gift card each for elementary, middle, and high school participants. The committee would like to give the whole prize (\$75) to that one winner. Jason will check with the City to see if that is okay with the accounting department.
- 6. Next Year: Consider scaling the prize money based on age. Perhaps we can increase the prize for High School winners to \$50. Budget for prizes has not been determined in the past, this is up to the committee to adjust. We may want to provide more than a certificate for honorees as well.

ii. Newsletter Subcommittee

- 1. Jessica has stepped down as the chair of this committee due to time constraints
- 2. The committee thanks her for her work on this sub-committee.
- 3. We are looking for someone to step into this role. Carlo will be reaching out individually to see who may be interested. We have a full calendar of topics for each issue this year, so the new chair is in a good place to take over the project.

iii. Race Equality Subcommittee

- 1. We will paint the mural March 13-14 and March 20-21
- 2. We will be reaching out to CRC members for volunteers as we approach the date
- 3. We need monetary sponsors to help support the artists. If you know anyone who has a business, please reach out to them. We are asking that each committee person get one sponsor. Carlo has provided a donation letter. Each sponsor can contribute towards the \$500 per artist. We also need to reach out to restaurants to look for snacks or meals for artists and volunteers while the mural is being painted. Deadline is March 5 for monetary sponsors.

iv. MLK Subcommittee

- 1 What went well:
 - a. Virtual event was produced very well. It was spot on and flowed extremely well.
 - b. Keynote speaker was very interesting and engaging.
 - c. All the way around, the event was excellent.
 - d. The presentation for the students went really well. It was great to do it at the school district office and have the superintendent there. We may want to continue to do this in the future, even if we are back at First Baptist.
 - e. If we can't meet in person next year, it would be great to use the same format next year.
 - f. The iDream parade was well-accepted and the community was excited about it.
 - g. Chair was very impressed with how the event turned out for the first virtual event.
 - h. We were able to reach more people and different audiences since it was free and virtual.
 - i. We adapted and adjusted well. It was all good.

2. Suggestions

- a. It may be nice to invite the nominator for Dream Keeper to be invited to the presentation of the award and be given an opportunity to speak or do a special video for the production.
- b. Essay Competition was a difficult piece. There were glitches, but that is to be expected with a brand new format.
 - i. When it came down to the votes, there was a lot of back and forth.

- ii. We need to be clear on what our expectations are and how to tabulate the winners
- iii. We need to have a clear rubric to make sure it is fair to all participants. We need to make sure there is a clear point system.
- iv. We need to be sure that we adhere to any cutoff deadline that we set.
- c. We could use 1-2 more members on this sub-committee to be sure that the workload is not too heavy for the members.

b. Elections

- i. Carlo's term as chair will be ending as well as Cynthia's as vice-chair and Summersby as Secretary. We need to start thinking about who we would like to fill those roles. The only stipulation is that we would like someone who has been on the Council at least a year.
- ii. Nominations will be due to Jason via email prior to the next meeting. We will also take nominations from the floor at the March meeting. Jason will set up a voting mechanism via zoom.

4. Old Business

a. Idream Week

- i. Went very well and was well received by the community. The committee would like to continue this partnership, but we will need to make an assessment next year when things will (hopefully) be different from the virtual events this year. We should keep it on our radar as something we would like to be involved with.
- ii. We should reach out to the group for their debrief after the event to see where we may be able to help and what could be improved.
- iii. Perhaps we should create a set of guidelines for partnerships with CRC within the community so there is a vetting system and some intentionality. Dr. Yang is happy to help with this endeavor. Anyone that wants to help should reach out to Dr. Yang for a one-time meeting.
