**BUSINESS:** Strategic Plan Update

• The quarterly report is being compiled for July-September.

#### Master Plan Update

- Tech Park bridge #3 has been ordered; BMX track demolition is complete, and asphalt will soon be applied to the updated course; the canoe/kayak launch is in process at the new park on Lake Wylie; the Carroll Park playground upgrades are on schedule and the shelter is expected to ship in early 2022.
- Jack and Emily Cox have given \$50,000 to the Rock Hill Parks Foundation which will assist in
  updating the Will Cox Courtyard including 16 bronze plaques. Two swings have been added at
  the Shade and Water Garden at Glencairn. Victory Garden fencing at Emmett Scott is
  complete.
- Outdoor sports tourism facilities hosted 5 events in September with a \$4.5 million direct economic impact. The Sports & Event Center hosted 4 events in September with a \$600k direct economic impact.
- The downtown restroom project is in the permit/structural planning phase.

**BUSINESS:** Advisory Committee Report

 Commissioner Rhea reported on positive feedback from the Parks Foundation Board regarding the projects at Emmett Scott.

#### **Program Report**

- Miracle League opens on October 9. A brief ceremony will be held at 10 AM followed by games at 10:15 and 11:15. The league currently has 64 players and 100 "buddies" have been trained to work with the players/program.
- Approximately 4,000 people attended the grand opening of Miracle Park on September 18. Community Outreach Report
- A bike safety program was held with 17 enthusiastic Cub Scouts. The City will reach out to more organized groups such as scouts to promote bike safety.

• The potential merger with Visit York County has not been finalized.
