IN-HOME DAY CARES

City of Rock Hill requirements for in-home day cares

A. Operational requirements

- 1. The primary use of the property must be a single-family detached residence. In-home day cares cannot be in a single-family attached residence (such as a townhouse or duplex) or in multi-family complex (such as an apartment or condominium building).
 - Please also note: The Rock Hill Housing Authority does not allow in-home daycares in their facilities. Please contact the RHHA at 803-324-6350 for more information.
- 2. Residency: The principal owner of the day care must be a permanent resident of the dwelling.
- **3. Number of People Receiving Care:** In-home day cares are allowed to serve up to five children oradults, *including* the operator's own children or adult dependents.
- **4. Number of Employees:** While the day care may employ any number of people, only one employee can be on site at a time.

B. Physical requirements

- **1. Size:** The day care cannot exceed 30% of the heated floorarea of the principal structure or 600 square feet, whichever is less.
- 2. Parking and vehicle use: Three off-street parking spaces are required. If the day care uses vehicles for the transport of children off site, only two such vehicles can be kept on site at a time. These vehicles must be parked a) in a driveway or b) on an unpaved surface if they are located behind the front plane of the house in a side or rear yard. Prohibited parking locations for all vehicle types include any location that causes pedestrian obstructions (such as blocking a sidewalk) or traffic visibility issues, as well as along thestreet.
- **3. No Outdoor Storage of Materials:** The day care cannot store materials or other evidence of the business outside.
- **4. No Change in External Appearance**: The day care cannot cause a change in the external appearance of the existing dwelling and structures on the property.
- **5. Permitted Signage:** A one-square-foot wall sign may be affixed adjacent to the entrance identifying the day care within. No permit is required for this sign.
- **6. Outdoor Play Area:** If an outdoor play area is provided, it must be fenced with a solid fence at least four feet high.

Application process

- 1. Please apply for the business license and in-home day care permit using our business license application at www.cityofrockhill.com/newlicense. Complete the application for an inside-city, home-based business and describe your business as an in-home day care.
- 2. We will review the application. If the location is approved for an in-home day care, we will email you a zoning verification letter that the South Carolina Department of Social Services (DSS) Child Care Licensing Division will need to have before it will issue a permit for a home day care.
- 3. Request a Family Child Care Home permit from DSS to operate an in-home daycare.
- 4. If the DSS permit is approved, send a copy to our staff.
- 5. We will then be able to finalize the business license application process. We will send you an invoice for the business license and a \$50 permit fee. Once paid, we will email you the business license. You will need to renew the business license annually.
- 6. If you need a fence to satisfy the Outdoor Play Area requirement listed above, please submit (or have your fence contractor submit) our Fence Permit Application and describe the fence as one for an in-home daycare.

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
