Upon a motion by Councilmember K. Sutton, which was duly seconded and unanimously approved, approved Planning Commission recommendation regarding Petition M-2022-26 by York County Adult Day Services to rezone approximately 0.82 acres at 359 Park Avenue and adjacent right-of-way from Multi-Family 15 (MF-15) to Neighborhood Office (NO). Tax Parcel 629-05-01-007.

The existing adult daycare is a nonconforming use and needs extensive repair. Therefore, the applicant is requesting to rezone, demolish and construct a new facility that meets the City's setback and design standards. The rezoning will also make the adult daycare use conforming. The Planning Commission recommended approval of the proposed NO zoning at their November 1, 2022 meeting by a vote of 7-0.
