- a. Follow up on Community Round table/future events
 - Gave an overview of what they do in the community and how they can help
 - Gave out helpful information
 - Brought investigator who interacts with client who makes a complaint and walked through the process to make a claim.
 - Had a breakdown of how many complaints have come from the state so far this year (around 25).
 - They are available and a free service available to the community.
 - Would like to come back and host an event again as there was a community
 event conflict that influenced attendance. We would like to have a time at
 next event for attendees to speak with the investigator privately about
 concerns.
 - Idea: mini-conference in the Spring where they can talk in smaller groups about some of their services in more detail.
 - We would like to Reach out to Ayana or Robert and ask if the training they
 mentioned this summer for city council is different from what they presented
 at this event and what we can expect the CRC and Council to take away from
 the training.
 - The value may be in one-on-one conversations with council members and take

them a plan for what we want to do.

 - Presentation of the Dreamkeeper Award: The committee will discuss the options on Monday, Dec 13 at 6:30 PM. They will try to get the honoree to chambers in person, if not, they will award it before hand and share the video during the presentation.
 - Jason will order the physical award.
 - MLK Subcommittee will meet Tuesday, Dec 28 to review essays. They will meet at HNS at 11:00 AM
 - Angelo Jeter and Youth Poet Laureate are both available and will attend the event.
 - Choir- Tan is going to have a select group to preform rather than the full choir. She is going to find songs in the public domain- that way it will be okay to play over facebook live.
